

Monique Martin is an artist and art educator from Saskatoon, Canada.

Monique teaches at a designated Fine Arts School in Saskatoon. She teaches all the art from Kindergarten to Grade 8. Monique has lectured at workshops, conferences and taught in classrooms in many countries. Monique is a two-time winner of a National Teaching Award (1999, 2001) for combining art into other subject areas.

Monique has been nominated for the YWCA Women of Distinction and for the Lieutenant Governor's Arts Award for Innovation in the Arts (2006). She received the Governor General's Award for Excellence in Teaching Canadian History (2007). Monique received the Prime Minister's Award for Teaching Excellence in 2009.

Monique has had exhibitions of her professional artwork in Australia, England, France, USA and many galleries in Canada.

Monique generally paints large-scale pieces and also works in the printmaking medium, block prints, clay and pastels.

Monique was Artist in Residence in Vallauris, France (2006), Wynyard, Tasmania, Australia (2003) and Coaticook, QC, Canada (2001). She is currently Artist in Residence for Georges Vanier School a designated Fine Arts School. She is also the World Tulip Summit Society Ambassador and Artist in Residence.
